



Batteries (EU Directives 2006/66/EC & 2013/56/EU)

Some Kodak Alaris Electrical and Electronic Equipment (EEE) contain batteries. This means the company ensures none are hazardous and are correctly labelled with a suitable symbol so that when the batteries are removed from the EEE they are treated correctly.



Kodak Alaris maintains a database of all batteries inside equipment such that we can calculate the amount of batteries placed on the national markets from our sales data.

The company is a member of several compliance schemes across the EU and we submit reports and pay fees accordingly to finance the cost of treating the batteries when they become wastes. For example, in the UK Kodak Alaris Limited is a member of a compliance scheme EcoSurety and is registered with the national Environment Agency **BPRN03578**:-
